



## MEMORANDUM OF UNDERTANDING BETWEEN SPOKANE PUBLIC SCHOOLS AND THE SPOKANE EDUCATION ASSOCIATION REPRESENTING ALL SEA REPRESENTED EMPLOYEE GROUPS

## 2020-21 School Year Calendar

The Spokane Education Association and the Spokane School District agree to the terms of this Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) to address the unique circumstances related to the COVID 19. It is also acknowledged that the global pandemic of COVID-19 is an unprecedented developing situation, in the event the expectations from the state or federal government change the parties will reconvene. The terms made as a result of this Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) are one time only and non-precedent setting. All other portions of the Collective Bargaining Agreements not addressed here shall remain in full force and effect.

The District and Association agree to the following calendar for the 2020-21 school year.

## August 31st – September 4th Staff Professional Development

The Professional Learning Improvement Day from October and four (4) hours from Conference hours and three (3) hours from Principal directed time will be moved to September 3<sup>rd</sup> and September 4<sup>th</sup>, creating a full five day week for staff prior to the student start to be used as follows:

- August 31<sup>st</sup> will be utilized as follows:
  - **AM** Principal Directed (Focus on staff well-being/teacher check-in) + logistics + support (How do we build community 'from a distance')
  - PM Models (building specific implications)/Conference Screener introduction and prep
- September 1<sup>st</sup> will be utilized as follows:
  - **AM** District directed Content or Grade Level Blended Learning/Digital Tools (instructional strategies/pedagogy/application of tools and delivering instruction in a virtual setting)
  - PM Department/Grade Level Planning
- September 2<sup>nd</sup> will be utilized as follows:
  - AM Superintendent message (all), SEL (elementary), Equity Resolution and Discipline Plan (secondary)
  - **PM** Models (all), SEL (secondary), Equity Resolution and Discipline Plan (elementary)
- September 3<sup>rd</sup> will be utilized as follows:
  - AM Safety Trainings (Common training for subs, classified, certs)
  - PM Conference Prep and Department/Grade Level Planning
- September 4<sup>th</sup> will be Teacher Workday

September 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> training days shall include all staff.

All of the training during the week of August  $31^{st}$  – September  $4^{th}$  will be held virtually. However, staff can choose to be on site.

Classified School calendar: Due to the October PLID day (October 9) and the weather make up day in March (March 15) now becoming student days, employees who previously did not work on the PLID and now have to work on the weather make up day will follow the adjusted start/end date chart below. Any employee can work with their supervisor if they have a scheduling conflict around the PLID day.

## September 8<sup>th</sup> – 11<sup>th</sup> Parent-Teacher Conferences

The week of September 8<sup>th</sup> through the 11<sup>th</sup> shall be utilized for Parent-Teacher conferences. This will move the November Conference week for both Elementary and Secondary to this week. These days shall count as student contact days.

Conferences will be held virtually or in person at the discretion of the employee. Buildings will develop a schedule to adhere to safety protocols including limiting people in a building at a given time.

Conferences will be conducted with each family for Elementary, including WA-KIDS conferencing, and for each family of advisory students for Secondary. Elementary specialists will offer short live webinars for families to attend during the conference week to describe and orient families to how their content will be delivered in a virtual environment.

This time will also be used to schedule IEP meetings. IEP meetings will be held virtually unless an inperson conference is requested by the parent. At the discretion of the employee, the IEP meeting may be held in person. Buildings will develop a schedule to adhere to safety protocols including limiting people in a building at a given time.

Staff will use their professional judgement after conferring with building administrator to flex the times they are scheduling with families to meet the families' need.

In the event a switch from full remote to an in-person model is needed as an entire system or as a partial/rolling transition, those affected by the switch will be granted the following time to support the transition:

- The differentiated instructional blocks in the afternoon in the real time remote model will be cancelled for one full week.
- The principal directed meeting/collaboration time in the real time remote model will be cancelled for one full week.

Conferences will be used for meeting families, ensuring kids/families have knowledge of technology tools and community resources, checking in related to needs of the family and social emotional health of the student, coordinating related services including ELD and interventions, explaining the days schedule for learning, holding IEP meetings, updating health care plans. The district will send out a pre-conference needs assessment survey and will organize technology/supply checkout prior to the start of the conference week.

Friday Collaboration is outlined within the bargained schedules for both face-to-face/hybrid model and the real time virtual model

- Open Houses will not be held during the 2020-21 school year.
- First day of school for students: September 14<sup>th</sup>
- Semester Break: February 1<sup>st</sup>
- March 15<sup>th</sup> weather make up day will now be a student instructional day
- Last Day of school for students: June 18<sup>th</sup> (1/2 day)

Elementary conference week in March will remain, with the exception that only three (3) hours of time outside the student day will be utilized rather than 3.5. The parties will reconvene to discuss the impacts of March conferences in the event Elementary schools are in the full remote model.

The remaining pieces of the calendar shall remain the same.
