



MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING BETWEEN THE SPOKANE SCHOOL DISTRICT AND THE SPOKANE EDUCATION ASSOCIATION REPRESENTING CERTIFICATED STAFF – New Tech Skill Center

The District and the Association agree that the following memorandum of understanding represents a solution regarding Peer Professional Learning (PPL) as it relates to NEWTECH Skill Center and the challenges around the student schedule and early release of students on Fridays.

This MOU modifies current Peer Professional Learning language in Article IV, Section 28, A:

Professional Peer Learning is defined as time for educators to work with one another in order to support student learning. Participation in Professional Peer Learning time must be performed with other education professionals on activities determined by the employee. Participation in Professional Peer Learning time must be performed on district property.

Professional Peer Learning time can include but is not limited to:

- Unit/lesson design based on curriculum guides and grade level expectations
- Sharing best pedagogical practices
- Discussing student work
- Analyzing student data
- Learning together
- Book studies
- Deepening content knowledge
- Participation in staff development programs to improve skills in current teaching assignments

For the 2017-2018 school year, the parties agree to the following modification to PPL language relative to Skill Center staff beginning September 29, 2017:
